

#### From the Rector

Alleluia Christ is Risen!

It was a week ago that we celebrated the first Easter morning and first shouts of Alleluia were heard. It was a week ago that we heard about Mary Magdalene making her way to the tomb and finding the stone not in place but rolled aside. The tomb was empty and the burial linens the only thing to be found. Eventually she did see the risen Christ and told the other followers of the incredible news.

While that is what we heard last Sunday, the gospel reading for this coming Sunday picks up from that same day. Not a week later but the same day, the followers of Jesus Christ have gathered in an upper room and Jesus is suddenly present among them. He offers words of comfort: "Peace be with you." These words continue to hold great importance in our Eucharistic liturgy. Jesus' words to his followers long ago are also his words to us today. While so many of us seek out and explore ways to find this inner peace, we discover that Jesus is praying this for us: that we may know God's peace in the greatest depth of our heart and soul.

Edwin Markham wrote this poem, *The Place of Peace*, that perhaps speaks to this:

At the heart of cyclone tearing the sky
And flinging the clouds and the towers by,
Is a place of central calm;
So here in the roar of mortal things,
I have a place where my spirit sings,
In the hollow of God's palm.

Where are the places that you know the peace of God? Where are the places that you feel held in the hollow of God's palm? Where do you discover the risen Christ coming to you and whispering those words: Peace be with you!

God of peace, as our lives get filled with countless pressures, expectations and fears, the words of Jesus keep calling us back to you and your love for us: Peace be with you. Fill us with that peace, let is wash over us, help us to invite it into our hearts, may it nourish our souls to awaken to your invitation to draw closer. For

in the resurrection of Jesus, we see that you will walk with us all our days and even beyond this world. Bless us with your peace now and always. In the name of Jesus Christ, the risen One, we pray. Amen.

#### **Church Interior Working Group**

Our Church Interior Working Group has been tasked with exploring some new ideas in regards to the interior of our beautiful church here at St. John's. We have a very large seating capacity which does not speak to the sense of community and connection that we cherish here at St. John's. We have looked at possible new locations for the Altar, the Font, and the Organ Pipes. We have looked at adding a Labyrinth, reducing the number of pews, changing the design of the chapel and the children's area. We have thought about the Granville Street entrance and a new sign out front.

We passed along those ideas to the Architect (and parishioner) Arno Matis and he has created a first look at some concept drawings that help us to see what the church interior could look like if we want to follow through with this thinking.

The Church Interior Group will meet again on **May 9 at 7:15 pm** to hear from Arno and his inspiration for creating these concept drawings. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

#### **Pre-Synod Archdeaconry Chapter Meeting**

Diocesan Synod will be held on May 26 and 27 at the Italian Cultural Centre. One of the issues coming before Synod will be about Diocesan Finances. In particular, the formula for determining Parish Assessments has been revised and the new formula will be presented to Synod in hopes of approval.

On April 26 at 7:00pm we will have an Archdeaconry Chapter Meeting here at St. John's in our Trendell Lounge. Synod Delegates, Treasurers, and Wardens are encouraged to come to hear about what will be presented at Synod. We will also discuss how we as the parishes of the Archdeaconry of Vancouver might have stronger connections with each other.
