

Trinity Sunday

From the Rector

This coming Sunday is Trinity Sunday. Our hymns, readings and other parts of the liturgy will reflect our understanding of God in three parts. The Holy Trinity of God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is sometimes seen as confusing and difficult to understand. It can seem to divide God into three distinct parts. It can seem to confuse what we mean with we say the word God. It can seem to bring in philosophical arguments rather than prayerful connection to God. But I think it really invites us in to a relationship with God.

Miroslav Volf writes this: "Because the Christian God is not a lonely God, but rather a communion of three persons, faith leads human beings into the divine communion. One cannot, however, have a self-enclosed communion with the Triune God- a "foursome," as it were-- for the Christian God is not a private deity. Communion with this God is at once also communion with those others who have entrusted themselves in faith to the same God. Hence one and the same act of faith places a person into a new relationship both with God and with all others who stand in communion with God."

The Trinity of God invites us into the mystery of God. Frederick Buechner writes this: "The much maligned doctrine of the Trinity is an assertion that, appearances to the contrary notwithstanding, there is only one God. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit mean that the mystery beyond us, the mystery among us, and the mystery within us are all the same mystery. Thus the Trinity is a way of saying something about us and the way we experience God."

In Celtic Tradition, the Trinity of God was a key element in describing their tradition. It pointed to this relationship, this mystery of God. Many of their prayers were written to reflect this closeness and this mystery of God. From *Poems of the Western Highlanders*, we read:

The three who are over my head, The Three who are under my tread, The Three who are over me here, The Three who are over me there, The Three who are in the earth near, The Three who are up in the air, The Three who in heaven to dwell, The Three in the great ocean swell, Pervading Three, O be with me.

As we consider the Trinity of God, Father Son and Holy Spirit; Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier, where do you encounter these three aspects of God in your life? Where do they touch you and form you and shape you? How do they guide your path this day? May you know the blessing of the Holy Trinity as you live out your baptismal covenant.

O God of mystery and delight, we give you thanks for your relationship and connection to our lives in the form of the Holy Trinity. You have called us into life with you by our Baptism, and the sign of the cross made on our forehead in your holy name. Guide us to live our lives as you call us to ministry and wholeness. In the name of the Creator, the Redeemer and the Sanctifier. Amen.
