First Sunday in Lent

From the Rector

This coming Sunday, the first in the Season of Lent, we will hear the gospel story of Jesus being driven out into the wilderness shortly after his Baptism. It is the story on which the Church has built the season of Lent, as we will take forty days to consider our own times of temptation and our own places of wilderness.



Temptation is a funny word that we use at this time of year, especially in Christian circles. The word temptation comes from the Latin word *temptare* meaning 'to handle, to test, to try.' But the word temptation seems mostly linked to religious connotations and those things that might be placed in our path to steer us off our pilgrimage. But it is more than that, for it starts to push us toward our morals, ethics and values and testing our resolve around them. How do we hold firm to what we believe is most sacred or vital to our lives?

For we cannot get through a day without being bombarded with temptations about how we should be better or stronger or more capable. But how do we push those doubts aside and simply pause to hear God's invitation to us? I think the word temptation, if we meditate upon it for a little while, starts to bring us to the question of "What is most important?" or "What is God asking of me?" or "What am I called to do and be?" These are the questions that I think that Jesus faced in the wilderness many years ago but they are questions we face almost every day.

This Lent take some time to meet Jesus in the wilderness and ponder that word temptation for a little while. Look beyond the definition of it relating to a test or being tried and instead consider how we are called to respond to God's love in this world. Where are we being invited to respond to the gifts that God has given us and share our response to them in our living, our prayers, our actions and our priorities?

Make this a holy Lent by considering where your pilgrimage is leading you.

O God of wilderness and wildness, bless the journey to which you have called me. Sustain me on Your way. Bless my path. Give me strength. Enliven my faith. So that this season of Lent is not merely giving up something insignificant but challenging my life to be significant. In the name of Jesus, my guide through this wilderness I pray. Amen.

A day of prayer and fasting for peace – Friday February 23

With the encouragement of leaders throughout the Anglican Communion, at the invitation of Pope Francis to all people of good will, we are invited to observe a day of prayer and fasting for peace, in particular for the peoples of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and of South Sudan.

"Our heavenly Father always listens to His children who cry to Him in pain and in anguish; 'He heals the broken hearted and binds their wounds' (Psalm 147, 3). I address a heartfelt appeal that we too hear this cry and, each person in his or her own conscience, before God, let us ask ourselves, 'what can I do for peace?'.

"Certainly we can pray; but not only this: each person can say a concrete 'no' to violence, as far as it depends on him or her." *Pope Francis*

We will open St John's church from 9 am to 5 pm. As you are able, whether in the church or elsewhere, for the day or for an hour, please join with brothers and sisters in all parts of the world, to pray for peace, for the binding up of wounds and restoration of wholeness, and to reflect on your own calling to be a messenger of peace.

We will conclude the day at 4:45 with a simple service of Evening Prayer.
