Second Sunday of Advent

Message from Mother Terry

When I was a child, my grandparents would try to encourage my affection for the season of Advent by giving me an Advent calendar with a piece of chocolate behind each door. Every day, I looked forward to peeling back the cardboard flap and discovering what shape the candy would take. Would it be a trumpet? A star? With these small surprises each passing day, my anticipation and excitement about Christmas would increase. Finally, on Christmas Eve, there was no mystery—the double doors would open to a larger piece of candy in the shape of Santa Claus.

This Sunday was supposed to be my first worship service with you. I had



so looked forward to seeing you face to face and sharing in this hopeful season of Advent together. It is tempting to focus on my disappointment right now. After all, this is not how we planned things! But in many ways, that's what Advent is all about. This is a season in which we remember the Word of God that came not to rulers, but to ordinary people in the wilderness. It is a season in which we remember holy births that took place in unusual circumstances. God's promises are often fulfilled in ways that surprise us.

When has God surprised you? When have God's plans complicated the plans you had made for yourself?

This Advent, I am making a practice of letting go of expectations. I trust that I will be with you soon. In the meantime, I am working remotely, getting caught up on parish life as much as I can. Please feel free to reach out if you'd like to have a virtual coffee on Zoom! I'd be delighted to meet you. I didn't buy chocolate Advent calendars for my children this year because I thought we would be moving early in the season. But in many ways, we're living out that experience in our daily lives, as we await the next phase of our journey. We greet each day with eager anticipation. What will today bring? Will I meet someone? Will I learn something new about the parish or about Vancouver? Will today be the day that our immigration is approved? We try to find joy in whatever small





blessings come our way. And each day, our excitement about the future grows. Though things seem uncertain right now, the ending is no mystery. We will be together, in God's time. For now, we wait with peace and confidence.

SJS Hospitality is back!! Volunteers Wanted

We are looking for people to volunteer during coffee hour. Regan has provided guidelines to increase covid safety:

- Each week we require 2 <u>fully-vaccinated</u> volunteers following the service to restock items and <u>clean up</u> after coffee hour. These volunteers will not be required to do anything ahead of the service only following the service during the coffee hour. Regan will set up before the service to make things much easier for hospitality volunteers.
- Since Covid, the selection of individually wrapped snack items has increased substantially. Parishioners are encouraged to purchase and donate individually wrapped items that could be made available at coffee hour. These could include single serve cookies, cheese, crackers, chocolates, and other sweets. Please submit your receipts to the office for tax purposes, or simply put them in your donation envelope during the service. Note: at the moment we are well-stocked for coffee hour snacks.

Fully-vaccinated (if they qualify) people are welcome to join us. Masks are required (unless actively eating or drinking) and please keep two metres apart. Please do not bring food from home at this time.


