Pandemic Ponderings

We have an ongoing 'discussion' in our house about the colour of Sunday's candle. Some years we have blue Advent candles and some years purple (I like blue, my spouse prefers purple), but we always have one odd coloured candle. It's the Rose candle- the candle of Joy, only I prefer to call it pink. Not only does it reflect the colour more closely (it needs more grey if it's going to be rose) but it drives my spouse bananasso it's a win/win either way!

This Sunday, the 'pink' candle and the theme is Joy or in Latin Gaudete. I love that we pause in Advent to make room for Joy. Just like the 'pink' candle stands out from the blue and purple just by being a little different, Joy stands out from the rest of December. Joy is different than nice, and it's different than fun, and it's different than happy. It's deeper than that, it's more expansive somehow. Joy is quiet and can come even when we aren't happy- somehow sneaking up on us and surprising us with wonder. Its bigger than nice, and it's more profound than fun. Joy is holy- it's the holiness that finds us in the midst of life.

So no matter the colours of your candles; blue, purple, rose or pink, how are you finding some holy joy this Advent?

OVERALL THEME OF THE READINGS

All through these scriptures spiritual help is being offered to lift the burden of fear and anxiety. In each case the thing is to act!. This is a beautiful and lyrical passage. We are listening to a wise and gentle counsellor who believes that trouble may be ahead that is probably

unavoidable. For us who read Zephaniah's words there is our concern about the future because of the still unknown Covid variant called Omicron. Rippling across the news feeds of the world there is fear and anxiety.

THE FIRST READING ZEPHANIAH 3:14-20

Zephaniah tries to focus people to look beyond the coming trouble. To achieve this he takes a surprising direction. He wants to jolt people out of their anxiety. He suggests there may even be some cause to sing and rejoice! He offers no less than six reasons for this...

- 1: "O daughter Jerusalem". The fact is that we and God are linked in a living relationship
- 2: *The Lord has taken away his judgements against you"* . In spite of the difficulty we have in believing it, we are always forgiven and accepted by God.
- 3: "The Lord is in your midst" God is actually with us. we are not alone.
- 4: *The Lord your God will renew you in his love*". God has the power to renew us if we are prepared to be open to that power.
- 5: *I will deal with all your oppressors*". I have an ally in my efforts to deal with the many things that oppress me as a human being.
- 6: "I will bring you home". God can bring the torn and fragmented parts of our lives together, all the unresolved stuff that keeps us from being at peace with ourselves, with other people and with God.

CANTICLE 3 Isaiah 12:2-6

The stance of faith in the Bible is always from the human self to to a reality beyond the self - God. Whatever we call what we are seeking - Salvation, security, stability - is not found merely in the autonomous human self. Strength is drawn from the relationship between the self and God.

"Give thanks to the Lord. Sing praises..." Worship is an intimate part of our relationship with God. Worship is to our relationship with God as lovemaking is in our relationships with one another.

THE SECOND READING PHILIPPIANS 4:4-7

Rejoice in the Lord always writes Paul. He feels joyful because the

congregation in Philippi is in good shape. A healthy congregational vitality with a sense of our Lord being present can be wonderfully contagious. "Let our gentleness be known..." We need to remember that quality when we have to differ about issues in congregational life. "Do not worry about anything". Let's face it, easier to say than to do! But there is a truth here. Congregations can do a lot of worrying. Will the money come in this year? Will we get teachers for the children? Will the roof be OK for a while? But the irony is that the answers depend on a whole set of other questions. Is ours a congregation that is essentially healthy? Is scripture a part of our lives? Is worship a vibrant experience? Do we care for one another as a congregation? Do we pray for one another when there is a need? Is there outreach from us as a congregation? Because when we can answer yes to these things then there can be a sense of peace - the peace of God that will guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

THE HOLY GOSPEL LUKE 3:7-18

Even though John's words seem harsh and tough, they seem to be received as good news by people. He is showing that a way into the future can be possible if people are willing to change some of their attitudes. "Bear fruits worthy of repentance," he says. John is saying that repentance is not merely looking back and seeing what has been missing or lacking. Real repentance involves acting on what we see when we look back! John is always trying to get people to ACT - not just to regret the past or merely to hope for the future - both of which are not bad but they are insufficient). Notice how John's style is abrasive, yet he is heard as a bringer of good news. Why? because nothing relieves fear and anxiety and indecision more than being given a course of action that is clear, focused and above all do-able!.

Regan will set up before the service to make things much easier for hospitality volunteers.
- Since Covid, the selection of individually wrapped snack items has increased substantially. These could include single serve cookies, cheese, crackers, chocolates, and other sweets. Please submit your receipts to
