
Ash Wednesday



So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. 

Please rise as you are able

Priest Dear friends in Christ,

every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery.

We begin this holy season by remembering our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign, speaking of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marking the penitence of the community as a whole.

I invite you therefore, in the name of the Lord, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the word of God. Let us kneel before our Creator and Redeemer.

Silence is kept

Please kneel as you are able to chant Psalm 51



Have mercy on me, O God, according to your 'loving'-kindness; *

in your great compassion 'blot out 'my off-'enses.



- ² Wash me through and through 'from my' wickedness * and 'cleanse me 'from my' sin.
- ³ For I know 'my trans-'gressions, * and my sin 'is ev-'er be-'fore me.

done: for our blindness to human need and suffering, and

our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Priest For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts toward

our neighbours, and for our prejudice and contempt

toward those who differ from us,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Priest For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack

of concern for those who come after us,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Priest Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us;

All Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.

Priest Almighty God,

from the dust of the earth you have created us.

May these ashes be for us a sign of our mortality and penitence,

and a reminder that only by your gracious gift

are we given eternal life;

through Jesus Christ our Saviour.






