and delighting in the human race.

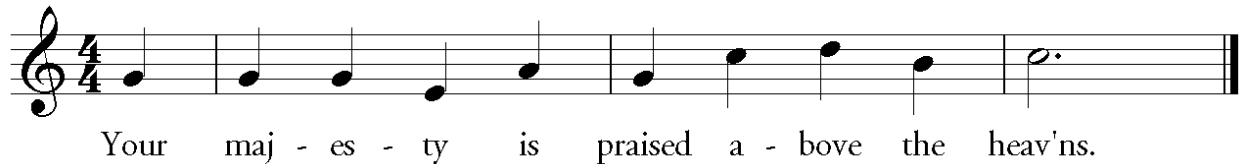
