

From the Rector

This week, I got invited to a birthday luncheon for someone I do not know very well. Has something similar ever happened to you? I received an invitation by which I felt both flattered and obligated. To make things even more complicated, the invitation was for the day before our family was moving into a new home, so there was much preparation to be done at my house, and I wasn't sure if I could spare the time to go to a social function. Yet I felt I shouldn't say no.

I am so happy that I listened to that nudge of the Holy Spirit and took the time to attend, even on a difficult day! I went to that event thinking I needed to "perform" on behalf of the parish, but instead I was ministered to. There was a fascinating and inspiring presentation, made by the guest of honour, about her own personal ministry—one of which I hadn't been aware at all! And I had a wonderful time getting to know some new people. By the time it was done, I didn't want to leave. From start to finish, I felt completely blessed to have been in that place at that time.

This has happened to me so many times in my ministry—thinking I'm going to go minister to someone else, but they end up ministering to me. People I've served on mission teams, who showed me what it's like to live and breathe joy, even amid extreme poverty. People I've visited who were dying, who witnessed to their faith in ways that increased my own. Youth I've mentored who have grown into adults whose passion and enthusiasm inspire me and bring me incredible hope for the future.

That's the thing about ministry—we are meant not just to give, but to receive. If we all just gave, who would be the recipients? In this Sunday's Gospel, we'll hear again the story of Jesus sending the disciples out with nothing, encouraging them to engage in their mission by making themselves dependent on others' hospitality. Rather than sending them out to be powerful, all on their own, he sends them both to do good deeds in his name, and also to receive the ministry of those whom they visit.

As we seek to follow his example more closely, let's pay attention not just to the ministry we're called to do for others, but the ministry we might receive from them. Whether we give or we receive, God is present. May we have eyes to see it.
