
### From the Rector

#### The Good Samaritan: Giving as an Opportunity

Someday I am going to ask my friend Paulus, the dancer, the potter, to make me a begging bowl which I believe my soul needs.

And if I come to you, to the door of your comfortable house with unwashed clothes and unclean fingernails, will you put something into it?

I would like to take this chance. I would like to give you this chance.

This week, we will hear the familiar story of the Good Samaritan. It just may be the most familiar story from the Gospels (aside from Jesus' birth and the Easter story). And what's not to like? We learn that neighbourliness extends beyond the people close to us, beyond the people we think are deserving, beyond the people whose needs present no threat to our own comfort and security. Jesus says a good neighbour is one who is willing to cross boundaries, even at his own peril, for the sake of healing and kindness.

Often, we focus on the conflicting duties of the characters, who may well believe they have a responsibility to the injured man, but who feel a more compelling responsibility toward ritual cleanness. They would rather avoid touching a potentially dead body than see what's going on and help a potentially living, but injured, person.

It's important to think about our responsibilities to others, as Christians, but wouldn't it be better if we didn't view neighbourliness as an obligation, or a competing good among others, but as a joyful opportunity? In the poem above, I love how Oliver offers relationship and connection to the reader through a shared risk—a risk that is also an opportunity. She will take a chance that the reader will offer something in her begging bowl, but in doing so, she is offering the reader a chance, as well.

Our acts of kindness are an opportunity, for each of us, to grow closer to Jesus and closer to one another. This week let's focus on kindness and mercy, and let's do our best to see our service to others as not only a responsibility, but an opportunity to receive God's grace.
