# **Diaconal Reflections: First Sunday of Advent**

### Isaiah 2:1-5

Let us go to the house of God, that we may learn his ways. We come to church for many reasons. Isaiah's invitation to learn the ways of God is perhaps the most powerful and challenging. For as we seek strength to live out God's truth in our lives, we are also challenged to discern what that truth might be. One place to start is peace - not just among nations but among ourselves. God may judge, we need not. In this time of conflict and challenge in our world, perhaps within our Church communities we can re-dedicate ourselves to the ideals of love and service to which God calls us. More compassion, less judgment, so that we may walk in the light of the Lord.

### Psalm 122

In promising to do good for Jerusalem because it is the place of the temple of God, the psalmist reveals what civic society has sought from time immemorial — to steward the places and communities where faith abounds. That hope for stewardship remains with us today, despite the not-so-benign neglect of faith or its even more troublesome manipulation by the dynamics of politics and power. Christians are called to witness to civic society on how a faith community can be unified, sacred, inclusive and evangelical and so be true to the ideals of one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. Let us embrace this call in our everyday lives, not just in our own parish but outside as well.

### Romans 13:11-14

The desires of the flesh – for so long in our history the fount of debate and disagreement, and not a little sanctimonious repression. But when Paul calls us to conduct ourselves becomingly, the challenge becomes one of priorities. If we really are awake to the reality of salvation in Christ, then we can truly cast off the petty human priorities that lead to jealousy and quarreling (not to mention debauchery and the rest). If we truly put on Christ, then as Martin Luther King famously proclaimed we're not worried, because we've seen the Promised Land. Seems to put our daily trials and tribulations in perspective.

#### Matthew 24:36-44

We may well ask the watchman to tell us of the night. But let's not just rely on the watchman. For we ourselves are called to watch, to be vigilant for the coming of the Lord. Jesus tells his followers that ours is not a wait-and-see faith. Neither are we invited to be passive and patient about the coming of the Kingdom of God. Instead we

are called to love and service, to bring about the Kingdom in the here and now, ever enlivened by the reality that God is with us. We're not just waiting for a miracle, we are called to get ready to be the miracle. For 'Lo, the Prince of Peace, the Son of God is come!' Advent is upon us.
