This year at midnight mass we even had a thurifer, who filled our space with the sweet smell of incense brought to us from Oman by Robyn Woodward.

It feels so good to offer our very best in worship, especially on big days like Christmas when we see a number of visitors. This year we had almost 170 people worship with us across our three services! Thank you to everyone who contributed to this great celebration.

Christmas, as a season, is the shortest of the liturgical year. In whatever way makes sense for you, try to make Christmas more than just a day.

To that end, I hope you'll join us for worship this Sunday morning at 10 a.m., when we will celebrate a service of Christmas Lessons & Carols. I know it's also New Year's Day, but it's our last chance to sing the carols together with organ and with one another. By the following Sunday, Epiphany will have come and gone, and we'll be on to the Baptism of Jesus. The season passes quickly. Let's enjoy it together!

WNM items for Homeless Needed


