From the Rector

As I write this, it is Friday, January 6—the feast of the Epiphany. This is the day when we celebrate the manifestation of God's glory in Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi. It also marks the conclusion of the Christmas season, as we turn our attention in the weeks to come to Jesus' baptism and the manifestation of his divinity in his earthly ministry.

Tonight, I will be the guest preacher at the Epiphany mass at the Church of the Holy Trinity in White Rock. Since Epiphany rarely falls on a Sunday, I'm glad to have the opportunity to observe the feast with "smells and bells" in my husband's parish. Please know that you are most welcome to join us at 6 p.m. for the service, and for a dinner afterward to benefit the Canada Ukraine Surgical Aid Program.

One of my favourite parts of the Epiphany mass is the reading of the Epiphany proclamation. This is a tradition that originated in a time when calendars were not readily available. Since many of the dates of the liturgical year are determined by the date of Easter, it was necessary to announce all those dates to the faithful at the beginning of the year. While technology makes it easy for us to look these dates up more easily, it is still a lovely tradition. I would like to share this year's Epiphany proclamation with you.

Dear friends in Christ, the glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return. Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation. Let us recall the year's culmination, the Paschal Triduum of the Lord: his last supper, his crucifixion, his burial, and his rising celebrated between the evening of the sixth day of April and the evening of the eighth day of April.

Each Easter – as on each Sunday – the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has for ever conquered sin and death. From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the twenty-second day of February. The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on the eighteenth day of May. Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on the twenty-eighth day of May. And, this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on the third day of December.

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the faithful departed.

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever. Amen.
