



Dear Friends in Christ,

As our season of expectation and preparation moves toward its conclusion, we have come to the final Sunday of Advent, and we look toward the celebration of the nativity of our Lord on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Our worship schedule in the coming weeks offers a variety of ways to experience the beauty and holiness of this season.

On Christmas Eve at 4 p.m., we will hold a worship service for all ages with a Christmas pageant, caroling, and Holy Communion. All children are welcome to participate in the pageant. (We ask that children arrive by 3:30 p.m. to find a costume.) This is a heartwarming service that invites us to enter into the beauty of the nativity story through the eyes of our young ones. Whether you have children or grandchildren or simply enjoy their wonder and excitement on Christmas Eve, you are welcome!

At 10 p.m., we will observe a traditional solemn "midnight" mass, at which we will rejoice in God's love for us, made known in the incarnation. Our choir will offer beautiful music, and our worship will be enhanced by the presence of a string quartet. The musical prelude will begin at 9:40 p.m. Please note that this service will include the use of incense.

On Christmas morning, we will celebrate Holy Eucharist at 10 a.m. This service is anticipated to be more intimate, but no less joyful. We will sing traditional carols and share Holy Communion together as we give thanks for the Word made flesh.

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas, we are invited to hear, once again, the good news proclaimed to the shepherds watching over their flocks. The greatest gift of Christmas is the salvation that has come to us in Jesus Christ. It is a blessing that comes to us not by our own striving or merit, but solely through the grace and mercy of God. As we respond in gratitude, we are called to follow the example of the shepherds, sharing that same Good News with others.

In that spirit, I encourage you to invite friends and family to join you in worship this Christmas. Did you know that 83% of visitors to church attend because they were personally invited by someone they know? Christmas is a wonderful time to bring a guest to church with you. And if you notice unfamiliar faces, please make sure to greet newcomers and encourage them to join us again after the holidays.

Finally, you will find special offering envelopes in the pews this weekend. I encourage your prayerful consideration of a Christmas contribution in gratitude for God's presence in your own life, and in support of our parish's call to share the good news of God's love with our community and the world. Your gift can be placed in the offering plate or returned to the church office. As always, I am grateful for your generosity and your support.

May Almighty God, who sent his Son to take our nature upon him, bless you in this holy season, scatter the darkness of sin, and brighten your heart with the light of his holiness.
