

From the Rector



The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, Fra Bartolomeo, 1516

Tomorrow is Groundhog Day. Many people throughout Canada will eagerly await the appearance of Wiarton Willie (or their other local favorite mammal or shellfish) in hopes that his shadow (or lack thereof) will predict an early spring. We've been in winter for about 6 weeks now and we're getting a bit tired of the dark and the cold. Day by day the light increases, ever so slightly, as we long for the spring, the new growth, and the life which comes along with it.

February 2 is also the Feast of the Presentation (which, by the way, has been observed much longer than Groundhog

day). This feast celebrates the presentation of Jesus in the temple 40 days after his birth. As recorded in Luke's Gospel, Joseph and Mary bring Jesus into the temple in Jerusalem, and they are immediately greeted by Simeon, who is filled with Holy Spirit. Simeon takes the child in his arms and declares that Jesus is the light to enlighten the gentiles and the glory of God's people. He testifies to the truth that God's light, which came into the world, shines in the darkness, and that God's light will lead all people to salvation. God's light fulfills God's promise to restore and redeem all creation.

As we continue through what remains of winter, longing to see the brightness of the sun, it is good for us to remember that the one true light, the son of God, is always shining brightly. The light of Christ shines in all places, at all times. And, if we allow it, the light shines in and through us so that we might bring the warmth and love of Christ's presence to all whom we meet. With the light of Christ as our source, we can be the mechanism of new growth in the world.

Those who believe the folklore of the groundhog will be pleased if Willie does not see his shadow. They will celebrate if, in fact, the fact that light does not shine on him. Yet, we know and celebrate the truth that light shines on us all! And what's more, we celebrate that no matter circumstances we find ourselves in, bright and sunny or gray and gloomy, God is with us, and the light of Christ will guide us.

So as we continue in this season, especially in the dark days that make us wonder if spring will ever come, let's remind one another of Christ's ever-present light, and let's eagerly look toward the shining brightness of God's kingdom.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper February 13 at 6 p.m. Trendell Lounge


This year, we will celebrate a traditional pancake supper on Shrove Tuesday. More information coming soon.
